

Local company taps into iPhone craze

A local company is benefiting from the iPhone frenzy.

Sena Cases of Tustin launched five iPhones cases around the same time the gadget debuted in late June. Since then, the local company said it has sold more than 15,000 iPhone products, which range from \$29 to \$52.

Apple said this week that it's on track to sell one million iPhones before the end of September, according to a Reuters report. Apple also said it was cutting the gadget's price from \$599 to \$399.

Sena has been in business for six years and sells other leather cases for Blackberries, PDAs and other hand-held devices. One of its iPhone cases can be worn while the iPhone is in its docking station.
